THE PRINCIPALS: A pair of undefeated teams early in Sun Belt Conference play will clash Tuesday when 1-0 A-State hosts 2-0 Louisiana-Lafayette. The Red Wolves, coming off their second open week of the season, carry a 3-3 overall record into the game, while the Ragin' Cajuns bring a four-game winning streak and 4-2 overall mark into the contest. Arkansas State and Louisiana-Lafayette, which both played in bowl games the last two years, have combined to post a 45-19 record since 2011. The two teams met on a Tuesday night in an ESPN2 televised game last year as well with the Red Wolves claiming a 50-27 victory in Lafayette.

QUICK GLANCE: Tuesday's game will pit two of the league's top four ranked teams in both scoring offense and scoring defense against one another, and the two teams possess the conference's No. 1 (Louisiana) and No. 2 (A-State) ranked rushing attacks. A-State is ranked No. 2 in the conference in total offense (481.3 ypg) and Louisiana is No. 5, while the Red Wolves are No. 6 in total defense (440.2 ypg) and the Ragin' Cajuns No. 3 (400.5 ypg). Another area to watch is the turnovers battle as A-State is ranked tied for 11th in the nation in turnovers lost (6) and Louisiana No. 7 in turnovers gained (16).

HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN: *Bryan Harsin* was named the Red Wolves' 29th head football coach on Dec. 12, 2012. Harsin is a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who has coached in 10 bowl games as either an assistant or offensive coordinator. Harsin, a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award recognizing the top assistant coach in the country, has been associated with two nationally-prominent programs during his rise to A-State's head coach. Working closely with Chris Petersen at Boise State and Mack Brown at Texas, two of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Harsin spent the last seven seasons as an offensive coordinator with the Broncos and Longhorns.

HIGH MARKS: Arkansas State head football coach *Bryan Harsin* was ranked as the sixth best hire in the nation among 26 new coaches at the time, according to CBSsports.com. The article written by Dennis Dodd said the following when referring to A-State's 29th head coach: "We're talking a Sun Belt program that has changed its AD (once) and coaches (twice) over the last two years. Somehow the Red Wolves went from national championship game offensive coordinator (Malzahn) to Fiesta Bowl-winning offensive coordinator with a stop in Texas (Bryan Harsin). Not too shabby."

STARTING STRONG: With the Red Wolves victory over UAPB, *Bryan Harsin* became the Red Wolves first head coach to win his inaugural game at the school since Larry Lacewell in 1979. ASU's previous seven head coaches all suffered setbacks in their first game, including Al Kincaid, Ray Perkins, John Bobo, Joe Hollis, Steve Roberts, Hugh Freeze and Gus Malzahn.

YOUNGEST FBS HEAD COACHES: At 36 years of age, Arkansas State head coach Bryan Harsin is the fourth youngest head coach in the nation. Western Michigan's P.J. Fleck is the youngest at 32 years old with a Nov. 29, 1980 date of birth.

THE ARKANSAS STATE - LOUISIANA SERIES: Arkansas State holds an all-time on-field record of 19-21-1 against Louisiana in the series that dates back to the 1953 season. As Sun Belt Conference opponents, Louisiana leads the series 6-5, but the Red Wolves have won the last two meetings. While A-State picked up a 50-27 win in Lafayette last year, the home team has won 10 of the last 12 meetings. Nine of the last 13 meetings have been decided by six points or less. Tuesday's game will be the 42nd meeting all-time between ASU and Louisiana. A-State's 41 games played against the Ragin' Cajuns are the second most against any opponent in school history behind only its 57 played against Memphis.

FAMILIAR FOE: While Arkansas State and Louisiana have both played as members of the Sun Belt Conference since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, it is not the first time the two teams have shared a conference. The Red Wolves and Ragin' Cajuns were both members of the Big West Conference from 1993 to 1995 and the Southland Conference from 1971 to 1981.

A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT: A-State has won its last eight consecutive Sun Belt Conference games to run its all-time record in the league to 50-37. The Red Wolves, who have won 16 of their last 17 league games, hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Monroe with 21. With the exception of Texas State and Georgia State, which are in their first season as a member of the league, the Red Wolves have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with Louisiana-Monroe and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since 2001.

off its 99th season of football Aug. 31, 2013, vs. UAPB. A-State now holds a 429-460-37 record since its inaugural 1911 season and has played in nine bowl games. ASU did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

MIDWEEK MONSTERS: Historically, A-State has performed well in midweek games since joining the Sun Belt Conference. Since the 2001 campaign, the Red Wolves hold an 11-3 record in all midweek games. ASU has won its last six midweek games, including a 41-34 victory over Troy on a Thursday night ESPN game earlier this year.

RED WOLVES OCTOBER: Arkansas State is undefeated in October over the last two seasons with an 8-0 record over that span and has won its last nine games in the month dating back to the 2010 season. A-State's first outing in October last year began a 7-game winning streak to close out its regular season. The Red Wolves' first game in October of 2011 was its second outing in a string of nine straight wins to end the regular season.

COMING OFF THE OPEN WEEK: Arkansas State is

coming off the second of two open weeks this season, with the other being prior to the Oct. 12 game against Idaho. Since joining the Sun Belt Conference in 2001, the Red Wolves hold a 10-6 record in games played after an open week. A-State has won nine of its last 10 games played following an open week.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . .: Make the Red Wolves 4-3 through seven games for the second consecutive year . . . Give it seven consecutive victories at Liberty Bank Stadium and secure a winning home record for the ninth straight season . . . Extend its winning streak in the month of October to 10 games . . . Give it 10 wins over its last 11 games played following an open week . . . Give it nine consecutive Sun Belt Conference victories . . . Extend its winning streak in midweek games to seven . . . Give it seven straight victories at Liberty Bank Stadium.

KNOCKING OFF THE FAVORITE: Arkansas has defeated the top pick in the Sun Belt Conference preseason coaches poll each of the last three seasons. The Red Wolves knocked off preseason favorite FIU in both 2012 and 2011 and Middle

since it opened in 1974. ASU's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985.

THIRD DOWN EFFICIENCY: Arkansas State has been one of the most successful teams in the nation this season converting third downs, ranking 27th in the nation and second in the Sun Belt Conference with a .479 percentage. The Red Wolves have converted at least half their third down attempts in three games and over 43 percent in all but one.

STARTING STRONG: Arkansas State has put together a scoring drive on its first possession in four of its six games, and scored on at least one of its first two possessions in all six. The Red Wolves scored opening-drive touchdowns against UAPB and Idaho and field goals against Auburn and Missouri. A-State also scored a touchdown on its second drive versus both Memphis and Troy. The Red Wolves have 64 points in the first quarter, their most of all quarters.

HITTING TWO-HUNDRED: Arkansas State has rushed for at least 200 yards in two games this season and in six of its last 11 regular-season games dating back to 2011. The Red Wolves have won eight consecutive games when rushing for 200 yards or more, a streak that also dates back to 2011.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense 40 of its last 44 games. The Red Wolves have posted at least 400 yards total offense in all but one game this season and is ranked 26th in the nation (481.3

ypg).

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Including a 62-point outburst in its season opener, 41 points scored against Troy and 48 versus Idaho, A-State has posted at least 30 points in 21 of its last 29 regular-season games dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves' 10 games with at least 30 points last year were their most since 1951 when they hit the total 10 times as well.

SUN BELT PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Senior quarterback **Adam Kennedy** and sophomore wide receiver **J.D. McKissic** were named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive and Special Teams players of the week following A-State's victory over Idaho. Kennedy recorded career highs for passing yards (375), total offense (397 yards) and passing touchdowns (4) during the game. McKissic recorded a career-high 125 kickoff return yards, including a 98-yard return for a touchdown in the contest. The return for a touchdown was the first by an A-State player since 2001.

MIDSEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Arkansas State placed 10 players, including five first-team selections, on the Phil Steele's Midseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. The Red Wolves 10 selections tied Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe for the most in the conference, and their five first-team picks matched the most along with the Ragin' Cajuns. The A-State offense and defense were both represented by four players, and two Red Wolves made the list as special teams choices. Arkansas State's first-team selections included sophomore center **Bryce Giddens (Moultrie, Ga.)**, senior guard **Steven Haunga (Richmond, Calif.)**, senior defensive lineman **Ryan Carrethers (Nashville, Tenn.)**, sophomore cornerback **Rocky Hayes (Heflin, Ala.)** and senior kicker **Brian Davis (Brentwood, Tenn.)**. The Red Wolves' second-team selections included senior running back **David Oku (Midwest City, Okla.)**, senior wide receiver **Julian Jones (Germantown, Tenn.)**, junior linebacker **Qushuan Lee (Prattville, Ala.)** and senior safety **Sterling Young (Hoover, Ala.)**. Sophomore wide receiver **J.D. McKissic (Phenix City, Ala.)** was also a second-team choice as a kick returner.

COVERING AT CORNERBACK: Sophomore corner **Rocky Hayes** has made a big impact in his first season on the defensive side of the ball, leading the team in both pass break-ups (6) and interceptions (2). He is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in passes defended with eight, which is only one shy of the most by an A-State player for all of last season (Chaz Scales, 7 PBU, 2 INT).

ON THE RISE: Senior WR **Julian Jones** has recorded at least four receptions in five straight games and six or more in four of the last five, including a career-high 10 versus Missouri. He now has 35 total catches over the last five games (7.0 per game). Jones has either led or tied for the team high in receptions in all but two games this season and is ranked 33rd in the nation in receptions per game (6.2). Jones' 37 total receptions are 20 more than he had for his entire career entering the 2013 season.

MORE ON JONES: Senior WR **Julian Jones** not only recorded a career-high 10 receptions against Missouri, he also finished the game with a career-best 136 receiving yards. He followed that up by posting 135 yards against Idaho to give him 271 over the last two game. He is ranked third in the Sun Belt

2013 ARKANSAS STATE FOOTBALL NOTES: vs. Louisiana

Conference and 50th in the nation with 78.2 yards per game. Jones has been on the receiving end of a score in eight of the last 12 games dating back to last year. Jones enters Tuesday's games needing just 49 yards to break 1,000 for his career.

LEADING THE LEAGUE: Senior quarterback **Adam Kennedy** currently leads the Sun Belt Conference in total offense with 285.8 yards per game, which also ranks 26th in the nation. Kennedy recorded 358 yards of total offense against Auburn, 334 versus Missouri and a career-high 397 against Idaho. He also just missed going over 300 versus Troy with 299 to his credit. His 397 yards last game were the fifth most in school history.

MAKING A CONNECTION: Senior QB **Adam Kennedy** tied the school record for completions in a game with 37 against Missouri (tied Ryan Aplin, 2011 vs. Western Kentucky). Kennedy has already completed 138 passes, leaving him just 18 shy of the 10th most in school history for a single season. He is ranked 13th in the nation in completions (23.0 pg) and 19th in completion percentage (.680). His current completion percentage currently stands tied for the highest in school history with Aplin's .680 set in 2012.

INSIDE FORCE: A member of the Bednarik Award and Outland Trophy Watch Lists, senior defensive lineman **Ryan Carrethers** is ranked second on the team and 13th in the Sun Belt in tackles with 38 through six games. He is averaging 6.3 tackles per game, one more than he averaged last season when he finished with 68 total for the most by an A-State interior defensive lineman since former NFL standout Jon Bradley in 2002. His 38 tackles this season are the most in the Sun Belt Conference by a defensive lineman.

ON PACE FOR 100: Senior linebacker **Qushaun Lee** has recorded a team-high 54 tackles, which is also ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference. He is averaging 9.0 tackles per game, which puts him on pace for 100 tackles for the second straight season. The last time an A-State player had at least 100 tackles in back-to-back seasons was 2003 and 2002 when linebacker Les Echols had 123 and 105, respectively. Lee tied his career high for tackles in a game with 15 against Idaho, giving him five career games with double-figure stops.

GRISWOLD VACATION TO THE END ZONE: Senior tight end **Darion Griswold** tied his career high with five receptions for a career-high 89 yards and his first two career touchdowns against Idaho, earning CFP national Honorable Mention Tight End of the Week for his efforts. He has now caught 17 passes for 230 yards, both the most in a season by an A-State tight end since Trevor Gillott recorded 24 receptions for 283 yards in 2009.

ON A ROLL: A Freshman All-America selection last season, sophomore WR **J.D. McKissic** has caught at least one pass in all 19 games of his career at A-State. He has come one strong the last couple of games, recording 24 of his 35 receptions this season against Missouri and Idaho. He had nine versus the Vandals and a school-record 15 against Missouri. McKissic also finished the Missouri game with a season-high 117 receiving yards, marking the fifth time of his career he has posted 100 in a game.

A FLARE FOR THE DRAMATIC: Sophomore RB **Michael Gordon** is responsible for two of the three

longest runs by A-State this year, including a 92-yard outburst against UAPB that was the second longest in school history. Gordon posted a 64-yard touchdown run against Troy as well, and he is averaging 10.8 yards per attempt (21). Gordon has two 100-yard rushing games, including a 102-yard showing against UAPB and a 115-yard effort versus Troy.

WELL ROUNDED: Senior RB **David Oku** has gone over 100 yards combined rushing and receiving in a game twice this season and nine times during his two-year career at A-State. He narrowly missed the 100-yard mark against Idaho with 69 rushing yards and 27 receiving yards for 96 total.

FINDING THE END ZONE: Senior running back **David Oku**, who posted 16 rushing touchdowns last season to tie the third most in school history, recorded two rushing touchdowns against both UAPB and Troy this season and one versus Idaho. Oku has now recorded at least one rushing touchdown in 13 of his 19 games played at Arkansas State.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: The Red Wolves opened Sun Belt Conference play in their third game of the season, the earliest since 2010 when they played their second game against a league opponent. A-State improved to 8-5 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers with its 41-34 victory over Troy. The Red

NFF RECOGNIZES DAVIS: Senior kicker **Brian Davis** has been announced as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete Awards candidate and a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes the top scholar-athlete in the nation. Davis is among 170 national candidates, including 54 from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), for the NFF's Scholar-Athlete Awards. Candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least a 3.2, possess outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

CFPA HONORS DAVIS: Senior kicker **Brian Davis** was named the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) National Specialist of the Week following the Missouri game. He was responsible for 13 of Arkansas State's 19 points against the Tigers, making all four of his field goal attempts and an extra point to lead the Red Wolves in scoring. Davis has now made multiple field goals in a game 13 times during his career. Dating back to last season, Davis has now made his last 10 field goals in a row to tie the second longest streak in Arkansas State history.

WEEKLY HONORS: Arkansas State had four players named a national Honorable Mention Player of the Week at their respective positions by the College Football Performance Awards after the Troy game. Those players included sr. DL **Amos Draper**, soph. RB **Michael Gordon**, soph. TE **Darion Griswold** and sr. WR **Allen Muse**. Gordon was also recognized by College Sports Madness as its Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week.

DAVIS HONORED: Senior kicker **Brian Davis** was named a national honorable mention College Football Performance Awards Placekicker of the Week following the Auburn game. Davis posted a season-high three field goals, giving him 44 for his career that leaves him one shy of tying the fifth most in Sun Belt Conference history. Davis was a perfect 3-of-3 on his attempts that covered 34, 21 and 42 yards. Dating back to last season, Davis has now made his last six consecutive field goals to leave him only one short of tying the sixth longest streak in school history. Including Auburn, Davis now has 12 career games with multiple field goals made.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: Arkansas State has 25 underclassmen (sophomores or freshmen) listed on its 2-deep. The list includes 13 sophomores, six redshirt freshmen and six true freshmen. Among the underclassmen, six are listed as starters on the offensive or defensive side of the ball. A-State's 25 underclassmen on its two-deep was tied for the 14th most in the nation with Colorado and Illinois according to the 2013 initial depth charts. Virginia listed 34 players on its opening-day two-deep for the most among all teams.

IN THE POLLS: Arkansas State ended the 2012 season receiving votes in the final major polls, including 28 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and 13 in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll. Both totals placed the Red Wolves 32nd in the nation. The Red Wolves were also among "others receiving votes" in the 2013 preseason and week two USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll.

NCAA RECORD: A-State became the seventh FBS team in NCAA history to have four players (**David Oku**, **Fredi Knighten**, **Michael Gordon**, **Sirgregory Thornton** vs. UAPB) rush for over 100 yards in the same game. The other teams include Arizona (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001) and Nevada (2009).

FOR STARTERS: A-State improved to 45-47-6 all-time in season openers with its victory over UAPB on Aug. 31. The Red Wolves claimed a win in their season-opening game for the first time since 2009.

RUSHING RED WOLVES: The Red Wolves piled up 509 rushing yards versus UAPB, which were the most in the nation during the season's first week and still stand as the second most behind BYU's 550 against Texas. A-State's total was also the fifth most in school history and the second most in Sun Belt history.

HOMECOMING HISTORY: With its victory over Idaho, Arkansas State improved to 58-27-1 all-time in Homecoming contests. The Red Wolves have now won 10 of their last 11 Homecoming games dating back to the 2003 season.

HOME OPENERS: With its victory over UAPB on Aug. 31, Arkansas State won its ninth consecutive home opener dating back to the 2005 campaign. The Red Wolves now stand 29-11 all-time in home openers at Liberty Bank Stadium and are also 15-6 in such games since moving to the FBS in 1992.

RETURNING ALL-SUN BELT PERFORMERS: Arkansas State returns five All-Sun Belt Conference players from the 2012 season, including first team selections **David Oku (Sr., RB)** and **Ryan Carrethers (Sr., DL)**. **J.D. McKissic (So., WR)** and **Brian Davis (Sr., K)** were both second-team choices, while **Qushaun Lee (Jr., LB)** was named honorable mention.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State placed a league-high seven players on the 2013 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. Senior running back **David Oku**, sophomore wide receiver **J.D. McKissic** and sophomore center **Bryce Giddens** all represented the A-State offense on the preseason squad. ASU's defensive players earning a spot on the team were senior defensive lineman **Ryan Carrethers**, junior linebacker **Qushaun Lee** and junior safety **Sterling Young**. Senior kicker **Brian Davis**, also made the list.

RED WOLVES TABBED THIRD IN PRESEASON SBC POLL: The Red Wolves were picked third in the preseason coaches poll announced as part of the league's annual Media Day. A-State received 45 points and two first-place votes behind UL Lafayette and UL Monroe, which both received 57 points.

ASU ANNOUNCES FOOTBALL FACILITY PROJECT: Arkansas State University has announced a \$26.7 million football facility project, including a two-level football operations building and 76,000 square-foot indoor practice facility in ASU Stadium's north end zone.

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its second consecutive outright Sun Belt Conference championship in 2012. ASU has won nine conference championships all-time. ASU won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970,

1969, 1968). ASU also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference title, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions. Prior to the 2011 and 2012 seasons, the last time ASU won back-to-back conference championships was 1986 and 1985 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

BACK-TO-BACK WINNING SEASONS: Arkansas State secured back-to-back winning seasons in 2011 and 2012 for the first time since 1986-87. ASU won 10 games in both 2011 and 2012, and its 19 combined regular-season victories were its most ever over a two-year span -- topping its 18 in 1974 and 1975.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: Arkansas State has been bowl eligible five times over the last eight seasons, including the last two in a row.

ATTENDANCE FIGURES: Arkansas State's average home attendance last season was a school record 26,398, topping its previous best of 21,256 in 2011. The 31,243 in attendance for A-State's 2012 regular-season finale against Middle Tennessee was the largest in Liberty Bank Stadium history, and ASU had two home crowds over 30,000 in the same season for the first time ever.

Bryan Harsin, a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who has coached in 10 bowl games as either an assistant or offensive coordinator, was named the Red Wolves' 29th all-time head football coach on Dec. 12, 2012.

Harsin, a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award recognizing the top assistant coach in the country, has been associated with two nationally-prominent programs during his rise to A-State's head coach. Working closely with Chris Petersen at Boise State and Mack Brown at Texas, two of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Harsin spent the last seven seasons as an offensive coordinator with the Broncos and Longhorns.

Harsin served the last two seasons as Texas' co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after spending the previous 10 on the Boise State staff, including the last five as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach as well. During his tenure at both schools, he guided offenses that consistently ranked among the nation's best in almost every statistical category.

In his first season at Texas, he had the task of putting a new offense in place with a young group that featured 10 different freshmen and sophomores starting for the Longhorns. Despite its youth, the offense was able to put up over 500 yards of total offense four times and rank 21st nationally in rushing offense with 202.6 yards per game. Harsin helped guide three different starting quarterbacks to 2,360 yards and 12 touchdowns in addition to the offense creating four other passing touchdowns.

His influence on the offense continued to pay dividends for nationally-ranked Texas last season as the Longhorns climbed 31 places to No. 24 in the nation in scoring with 36.1 points per game. Under Harsin's direction, Texas also generated 441 yards total offense per game last year and ranked ninth in the nation in passing efficiency. The Longhorns posted over 400 yards total offense in nine games and scored at least 30 in eight, including a season-high 66 against Ole Miss. Texas' Harsin-coached quarterbacks last season have combined to throw 23 touchdowns and both held a pass efficiency rating that ranked among the top 20 players in the nation.

He was at the helm of the Boise State offense during a five-year period where the Broncos posted a 61-5 record that included two undefeated seasons, which were capped by Fiesta Bowl wins over TCU in 2009 (14-0) and Oklahoma in 2006 (13-0). They reached at least 12 wins in four of his five seasons as coordinator and had three Top 10 finishes, including ranking No. 5/6 in 2006, No. 4/4 in 2009, and No. 10/10 entering the 2010 bowl season. In 2008, they finished just outside the Top 10 at No. 11/13.

In his five seasons as offensive coordinator at Boise State, Harsin's offenses were in the top five nationally in scoring four times, capped by ranking first in 2009 (42.2 ppg) and second in 2010 (45.1 ppg). They also ranked second in 2006 (39.7 ppg), fourth in 2007 (42.4 ppg) and 12th in 2008 (37.6 ppg). In all, Boise State averaged 41.4 ppg during his time as coordinator.

The Broncos ranked in the Top 10 in total offense in three of Harsin's seasons as coordinator and were no lower than 18th in all five of his years, culmi-

nating in 2010 with an average of 521.3 ypg, which set the BSU school record and ranked second nationally. In those five seasons, the Broncos offense averaged 459.9 ypg.

As quarterbacks coach, Harsin guided Kellen Moore into becoming one of the nation's most productive quarterbacks. In 2010, Moore was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America and became Boise State's first Heisman Trophy finalist. He was also a finalist for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award and was named the nation's top quarterback by The Touchdown Club of Columbus.

ESPN.com, SI.com and CBSSports.com named Moore first-team All-America, the Associated Press named him third-team All-America, while he also finished seventh in the 2009 Heisman voting and earned Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors.

In his third season as offensive coordinator, Harsin's 2008 unit was taken over by Moore, who was a redshirt freshman. Moore would compile one of the most outstanding seasons by any Broncos quarterback, finishing the year with a NCAA freshman record 69.4 completion percentage (281-of-405), 25 touchdown passes and just 10 interceptions. He was also named WAC Freshman of the Year.

In Harsin's first season as offensive coordinator, the 2006 Broncos went undefeated and running back Ian Johnson led the country in rushing touchdowns and scoring. He also set a school single-season record with 1,713 yards. He was named to four separate All-America teams and finished eighth in the Heisman Trophy voting.

From 2002-05 Harsin served as tight ends coach at BSU. That unit played a vital role in a Broncos offense that led the nation in scoring twice and finished in the top 10 in scoring in each of those four years. In 2005, four Broncos tight ends combined to catch 27 passes for 298 yards and three touchdowns. In 2004, Harsin helped the tight ends contribute to the top-scoring offense in school history (48.9 ppg).

In his four seasons as tight ends coach and one as a graduate assistant, Boise State had a record of 53-11, making the Broncos record in his 10 seasons there 114-16.

Prior to coaching the tight ends, Harsin was a graduate assistant with the Broncos in 2001. He was a member of the Bronco football team from 1995-1999, earning three varsity letters. He served as Boise State's backup quarterback in 1999 when the team went 10-3 and won the Crucial.com Humanitarian Bowl.

After graduating from Boise State in 2000 with a degree in business management, Harsin entered the coaching profession at Eastern Oregon, coaching running backs and receivers during the 2000 season.

Harsin and his wife, Kes, have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis. Harsin is a graduate of Capital High School in Boise.

JONESBORO, Ark. (8/31/13) – Four Arkansas State players rushed for over 100 yards as the Red Wolves cruised to a 62-11 season-opening victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff (UAPB) in front of 30,451 spectators at Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

Senior David Oku paced A-State with a game-leading 124 yards rushing while senior Sirgregory Thornton ran for 112 yards, sophomore Michael Gordon with 102, and sophomore Fredi Knighten had 101 yards as the Red Wolves tied a NCAA Division I FBS record for most players on one team gaining at least 100 yards.

Arkansas State, which is 1-0 on the season with the victory, snapped three-game losing string in season openers as the Red Wolves put on an impressive offensive performance against UAPB (0-1) with a team 509-rushing yards output in their first home season-opening contest since 2009. A-State's 509 rushing yards in the game represented the fifth time in which the Red Wolves have reached the 500-yard plateau in a contest.

UAPB came into the first-ever meeting with A-State as the defending Southwestern Athletic Conference Champions and the preseason favorite to win the SWAC Western Division title.

Arkansas State dominated the first half as the Red Wolves scored 48 unanswered points while rolling up 480 yards in total offense, including 344 on the ground, to hold a commanding 48-0 at halftime.

The Red Wolves led 14-0 after the first quarter on touchdowns runs by quarterback Fredi Knighten and redshirt sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic. Knighten's 21-yard scoring run at 10:33 on Arkansas State's opening possession capped a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive giving the home team a 7-0 lead. A-State added its second score of the game as McKissic went into the end zone from 14 yards out with 2:13 remaining in the opening frame.

Arkansas State continued its dominance in the second quarter by erupting for 34 consecutive points with all but one TD coming on the ground. David Oku scored his first of two TD's in the stanza on a two-yard scamper at 13:47 to give A-State a 21-0 lead after senior quarterback Adam Kennedy hooked up with running Michael Gordon on a 48-yard pass. Fredi Knighten broke through the UAPB defense on the ensuing play for a 79-yard gain to the UAPB one-yard line before netting the score on a one-yard keeper with 9:33 remaining. Oku would hit paydirt again for the sec-

ond time on a 17-yard rush as the Red Wolves extended their lead to 34-0.

UAPB's threatened to score midway thru the quarter as the Golden Lions moved the ball down to the A-State five-yard line, but turned the ball over on downs as quarterback Benjamin Anderson's pass on fourth down was incomplete. On the next A-State possession, Michael Gordon broke a tackle on the second play and outraced all defenders down the sideline for a 91-yard TD run to make it 41-0. The Red Wolves' final score before the half occurred with 2:09 left as Adam Kennedy connected with senior wideout Julian Jones on 22-yard TD pass play. Michael Gordon (102 yards) and Fredi Knighten (101 yards) combined for 203 rushing yards through the first half.

Arkansas State picked up right where it left off to start the second half as the RedWolves scored two third-quarter TD runs by running back Sirgregory Thornton, covering six and 31 yards, respectively. UAPB, trailing 62-0, would get its first points of the game with 6:23 to go in the stanza as the Golden Lions' Jer-ryan Harris scored on a 37-yard fumble recovery. UAPB came back to score again in the frame on a 39-yard Tyler Strickland field goal with just over two minutes in the third to account for the final margin.

The Red Wolves generated a program fifth-best 509 rushing yards and averaged 8.9 yards per carry to account for the bulk of their 672 total offensive yardage. A-State also totaled 163 yards in passing. ASU's defense held UAPB in check by limiting the Golden Lions to 173 yards of total offense, which consisted of 12 rushing yards and 161 through the air.

Adam Kennedy was nine-of-12 in the air for 149 yards in his A-State debut as seven different receivers caught at least a pass. UAPB's Benjamin Anderson threw for 161 yards on 13-of-26 passing with Dezmond Beverly on the receiving end of six aerials for 113 yards.

Defensively for A-State, senior tackle Ryan Carrethers posted a team-high eight tackles while junior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee contributed seventackles. Jer-ryan Harris was tops for UAPB with a game-leading 14 tackles to go with his TD fumble recovery.

AUBURN, Ala. (9/7/13) – Arkansas State saw its nation’s second-longest nine-game winning streak come to an end as the Red Wolves suffered a 38-9 loss to the Auburn Tigers in front of a crowd of 83,246 at AU’s Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala.

Arkansas State, which is now 1-1 on the season, battled Auburn (2-0) the entire game but the Tigers controlled the play on both sides of the ball for the majority of the non-league contest. The A-State setback was the Red Wolves’ first since a 26-13 home conference loss to Western Kentucky a season ago (9/29) and also snapped a four-game road winning streak.

Auburn started the game by scoring on its opening two possessions to claim a 14-3 lead with just under four minutes left in the first quarter. The Tigers stuck first at the 11:37 mark as quarterback Nick Marshall connected with wide receiver Marcus Davis on a third-down 18-yard scoring strike. A-State bounced back by tallying on its first possession as the Red Wolves marched 58 yards on 14 plays culminating in senior kicker Brian Davis’ 34-yard field goal at 6:54 to make the score 7-3. A 16-yard pass from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to sophomore tight end Darion Griswold highlighted the A-State’s initial scoring drive.

On its next possession, Auburn found paydirt again when running back Corey Grant scampered 17 yards into the end zone putting the Tigers up 14-3 with 3:56 on the clock. A-State took the ensuing kickoff and would get into Auburn territory, which was aided by a 40-yard Kennedy pass completion to sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic. The Red Wolves’ drive would stall at the AU 20-yard line on an unsuccessful fourth-and-one rush.

A-State was able to keep Auburn off the scoreboard until 2:20 remaining in the second quarter as the Tigers went up 21-3 following Nick Marshall’s 68-yard TD pass to sophomore wide receiver Sammie Coates. At the half, the Red Wolves compiled 161 passing yards while the Tigers had



139 to go with 143 yards on the ground.

Trailing 21-3 at halftime, Arkansas State came out in the third quarter by scoring six unanswered points on a pair of Brian Davis field goals to close within 21-9. Davis booted a 21-yarder at 9:58 to finish an 11-play, 71-yard drive, which was set up on quarterback keepers of 28 yards by Kennedy and 17 yards from sophomore Fredi Knighten. Auburn would turn the ball over on its possession as A-State junior cornerback Artez Brown recovered a Nick Marshall fumble on a third-and-11 situation within nine minutes to go at the AU 17-yard line and the Red Wolves would capitalize as Brian Davis made a 42-yard field goal with 7:53 left in the quarter. Auburn accounted for the final points of the stanza on an 11-yard TD run by running back Tre Mason with over a minute left to claim a 28-9 lead after three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, Auburn tacked on 10 more points with a field goal and a TD. Cody Parkey split the uprights from 35 yards out with 8:46 remaining and running back Cameron Artis-Payne, who ran for a game-high 102 yards, would score on a 12-yard run at 1:43 to wrap up the scoring.

A-State rolled up 24 first downs and 422 total offensive yards while Auburn had 23 first downs to go with 468 yards in total offense. Adam Kennedy led the Red Wolves with 74 rushing yards on 12 attempts to go with 29-of-41 in passing for 272 yards. Senior running back David Oku ran for 48 yards on 16 carries and had six receptions for 70 yards. Kennedy’s favorite target was senior wideout Julian Jones, who caught a game-high seven passes for 29 yards. Darion Griswold totaled five grabs for 46 yards.

For Auburn, Nick Marshall threw for 147 yards and two TD’s on 10-of-17 passing and also ran for 53 yards. Tre Mason chalked up 99 yards on the ground as the Tigers finished with 301 as a team.

Sophomore rover Chris Humes and junior free safety Sterling Young topped A-State defensively with 12 (nine solos) and 10 tackles (seven solos), respectively. Junior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee and senior nose tackle Ryan Carrethers contributed seven stops apiece. Cornerback Chris Davis’ 10 tackles (seven solos) led Auburn defense, which limited Arkansas State to 150 rushing yards.

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/12/13) – A 13-yard touchdown run by Arkansas State’s Fredi Knightsen with just under four minutes remaining coupled with four Troy turnovers led the Red Wolves to a 41-34 Sun Belt Conference (SBC) opening win over Troy this Thursday night (Sept. 12) in front of 26,012 fans at A-State’s Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

Arkansas State (2-1; 1-0 SBC) bolted out to a 20-7 first-quarter lead in the ESPN televised contest before Troy (2-1, 0-1 SBC) answered by scoring 14 straight second-quarter points to lead 21-20 at the half. The second half featured three lead changes with the Red Wolves snapping a 34-all deadlock late in the game to win their eighth consecutive conference outing dating back to last season.

Troy would have the game’s first scoring chance, but was able to cash in as kicker Will Scott’s field goal attempt from 49 yards out fell short. The Red Wolves took possession on their 32-yard line and moved the ball down the field to the A-State 45-yard line before senior quarterback Adam Kennedy lofted a pass toward the right sideline into the hands of senior wide receiver Allen Muse for a 55-yard touchdown at 7:50 to cap a four-play, 68-yard scoring drive. A-State would increase its lead to 13-0 as senior running back David Oku found the end zone on a two-yard slant with 6:31 left in the opening quarter, finishing a 45-yard drive covering three plays. A 29-yard halfback pass from sophomore wideout Tres Houston to sophomore tight end Darion Griswold followed by a 14-yard Oku rush set up the A-State’s second score after senior defensive tackle Amos Draper intercepted Troy quarterback Corey Robinson’s pass, which was initially tipped at the line of scrimmage by senior defensive tackle Dexter Blackmon.

The Trojans rallied on their next possession, cutting A-State’s lead to 13-7 as running back Jordan Chunn tallied on a one-yard TD plunge with 4:38 remaining in the first quarter. However, the Red Wolves would get erase those Troy points as David Oku lined up as quarterback in the Wildcat formation and outraced the Troy defenders to the goal line for a three-yard score to cap a 75-yard drive putting the hosts up 20-7 at the quarter’s 2:08 mark. A 43-yard Adam Kennedy aerial to Allen Muse on the previous play set up the A-State touchdown as the hosts lead by 13 (20-7) after 15 minutes of action.

A two-yard TD keeper by backup signal-caller Deon Anthony 13 seconds into the second quarter narrowed Troy’s deficit to 20-14, which was aided by an A-State pass interference call giving the Trojans a first-and-goal situation at the two-yard line. A-State maintained the lead until six seconds left in the stanza when Robinson connected with wide receiver Eric Thomas on a three-yard TD pass to claim a 21-20 halftime advantage. The Trojans received the ball with 1:33 left in the quarter and proceeded to march 43 yards in seven plays culminating in the score.

Arkansas State regained the lead in the third quarter at 27-21 as sophomore running back Michael Gordon took a David Oku handoff in the Wildcat formation and dashed 11 yards to paydirt at the 8:35 mark to conclude a 14-play, 80-yard drive. But Troy would strike back less than

two minutes later as Corey Robinson hooked up with wide receiver Bryan Holmes on a 58-yard strike as the Trojans took a 28-27 lead with 7:02 on the clock. The Red Wolves would erase the deficit on one play, a 64-yard TD run by Michael Gordon as the hosts would go back out in front 34-28. Gordon netted his second TD of the night as A-State’s blockers created an opening in Troy’s interior line as Gordon ran untouched into the end zone with 3:50 left on the board.

Troy managed to tie the contest at 34-apiece with 12:18 to be played as Deon Anthony hit wideout Chandler Worthy on a 53-yard scoring pass, but the Red Wolves caught a break as Will Scott missed the extra-point attempt. On the ensuing possession, A-State went three and out as Troy gained the ball at its own 18-yard line and drove into Red Wolves’ territory to the ASU 43 before sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes picked off a Corey Robinson pass at the A-State 40-yard line. The Red Wolves proceeded to capitalize on another of Troy’s four turnovers in the contest as Fredi Knightsen, a sophomore, recorded the game-winning score on a 13-yard quarterback keeper with 3:56 left to be played. Troy would use up most of the time remaining, starting from its 25-yard line and moving the ball all the way down to the A-State 26 to potentially create a scoring opportunity. But, the A-State defense rose to the occasion once again as junior Frankie Jackson intercepted Robinson at the six-yard line and returned the ball to the Red Wolves’ 25-yard line as the home team ran off the final 55 seconds.

The conference opener featured a combined 1,153 yards in total offense as Troy racked up 614 of those yards to A-State’s 539-yards output. The Red Wolves produced 228 yards on the ground and 311 in the air while the Trojans garnered 504 passing yards to go with 110 rushing yards. Individually, Adam Kennedy completed 20-of-34 for 282 yards and a TD with senior wide receiver Julian Jones catching a game-high eight for 65 yards. Allen Muse turned in his best performance at A-State by amassing 158 receiving yards on six grabs. Michael Gordon paced the Red Wolves’ ground assault with a game-leading 115 rushing yards and two TD’s on eight carries while David Oku ran for 74 along with two TD’s on 21 attempts. For Troy, Corey Robinson passed for 371 yards and a pair of TD’s on 30-of-51 passing but threw two interceptions. The Trojans’ other quarterback, Deon Anthony was five-of-six for 110 yards and a TD. Eric Thomas and Bryan Holmes were both on the receiving end of six passes for 125 and 117 yards, respectively.

Defensively, junior linebacker Qushaun Lee’s 12 tackles (six solos) led all players. Senior defensive end Eddie Porter notched eight stops and a fumble recovery while senior defensive tackle Ryan Carrethers, junior linebacker Kyle Coleman, and sophomore rover Chris Humes had seven tackles apiece. Amos Draper, Rocky Hayes, and Frankie Jackson all collected a passtheft.

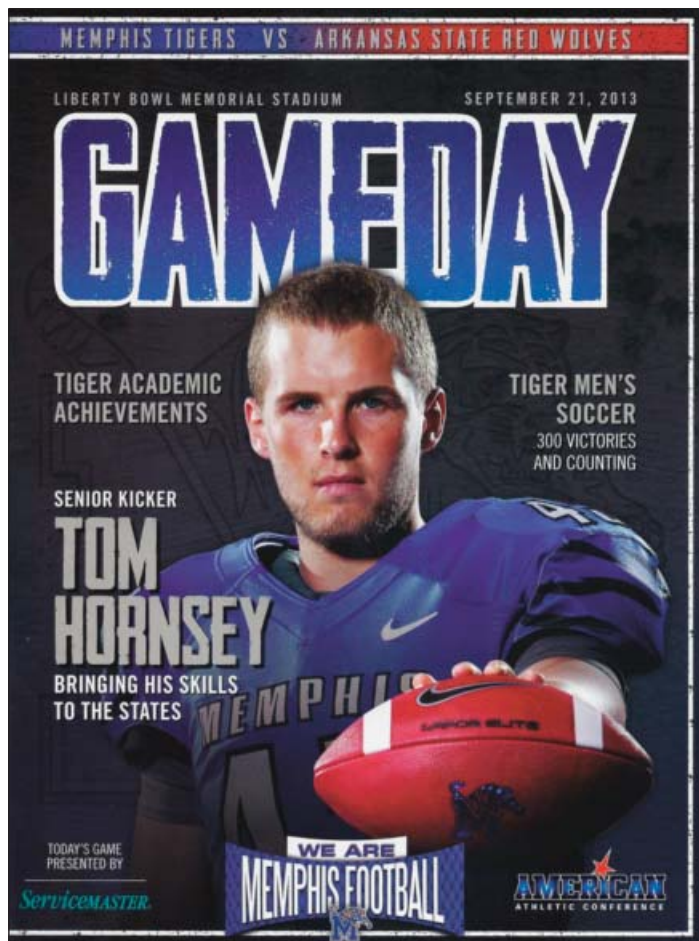
Memphis, Tenn. (9/21/13) – A quick start by Memphis with a 24-point out-punt in the first half fueled the Tigers to a 31-7 win over Arkansas State at the Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Memphis scored on both its first two possessions of the contest to build up a 24-7 halftime advantage in a rivalry matchup before a crowd of 36,279 fans.

With the loss, A-State fell to 2-2 overall while Memphis picked up its first win of the season in improving its overall record to 1-2. The Red Wolves came into the game having won four of the last five series meetings and hadn't lost to the Tigers since 2008 with a 29-17 setback at Memphis.

The opening quarter saw Memphis score on its first two possessions with a pair of touchdowns to take a 14-0 lead eight minutes into the game. A six-yard TD run by senior running back Brandon Hayes put Memphis up 7-0 at the 12:01 mark and the Tigers would hit paydirt again on their next possession as a result of freshman quarterback Paxton Lynch hooking up with sophomore tight end Alan Cross for a six-yard TD scoring strike. Arkansas State sliced Memphis' lead in half at 14-7 on its next possession as sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic caught a 15-yard pass from sophomore quarterback Fredi Knighten and vaulted from four yards out into the Tigers' end zone followed by senior kicker Brian Davis' successful point after kick with 5:03 to go in the quarter. The A-State scoring drive took six plays and covered 59 yards. Three straight pass completions from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to senior wideout Julian Jones, including the first of 22 yards, along with a 38-yard kickoff J.D. McKissic return help set up the Red Wolves' lone first-half score.

Memphis maintained the upper hand against A-State in the second quarter as the Tigers accounted for all of the stanza's scoring with 10 unanswered points to lead 24-7 at halftime. The Tigers' points came on freshman kicker Jake Elliot's 23-yard field goal with 9:52 left in the half and a five-yard TD run from freshman back Sam Craft at the 5:25 mark.



In the second half, Memphis tallied the game's final points as the Tigers increased their margin to 24 points (31-7) with 2:15 remaining in the third quarter following freshman running back Marquis Warford's 16-yard touchdown run.

Overall, Memphis rolled up 505 yards of total offense with 329 coming on the ground while Arkansas State produced 255 yards, 181 yards in passing and 74 in rushing. Adam Kennedy completed 20-of-37 balls and one TD for 166 yards despite facing constant pressure by the Tigers throughout the contest. A-State's Julian Jones caught six passes for 59 yards in the game to lead all receivers. For Memphis, Paxton Lynch hit on 17-for-26 of his passes for 176 yards while the Tigers also featured a pair of 100-yard rushers in the game, Marquis Warford with 173 yards on 11 carries and Brandon Hayes with 18 rush attempts for 114 yards. Both also recorded a touchdown in the non-league decision as the hosts converted five-of-seven chances in the redzone.

Freshman linebacker Xavier Woodson paced Arkansas State with nine tackles (five solos). Junior free safety Sterling Young finished with seven stops (seven solos) and had a fumble recover while sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes (five solos) and sophomore rover Chris Humes (four solos) also supplied seven tackles apiece. Junior defensive end Martin Ifedi spearheaded the Memphis defense with a game-high 10 tackles (seven solos), including 2.5 sacks for 11 yards and 4.5 tackles for loss. Memphis finished with seven sacks for 31 yards in addition to three quarterback hurries and two pass breakups.

A bright spot for A-State was sophomore Luke Ferguson, who punted five times for 231 yards to post a 46.2 yards average which also included a long of 58 yards.

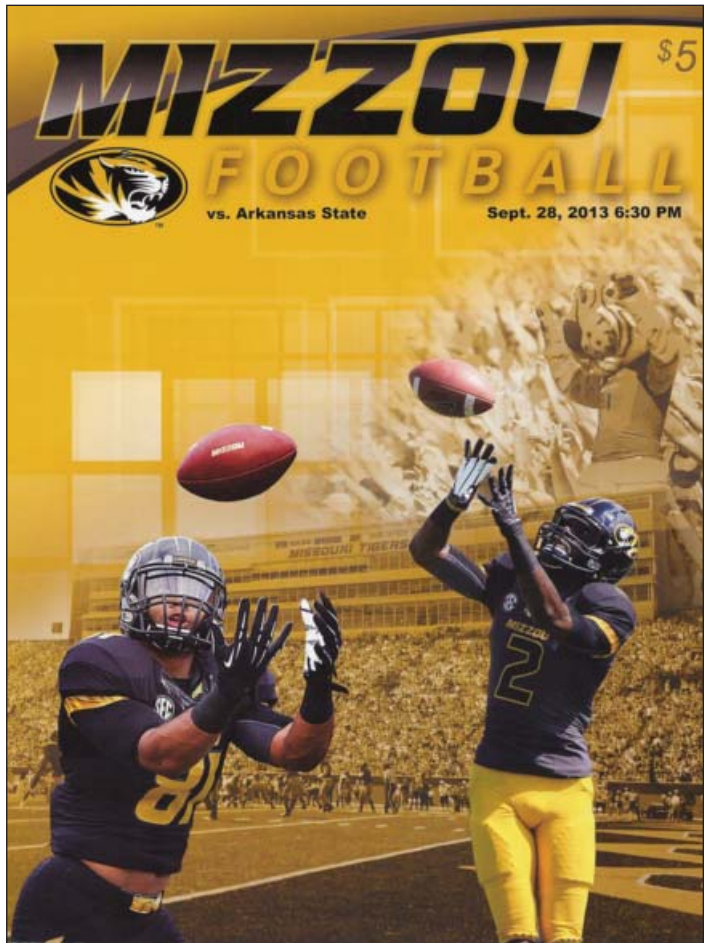

Columbia, Mo. (9/28/13) – A 21-point fourth quarter by Missouri proved to be difference as the Tigers handed Arkansas State a 41-19 loss at Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium in Columbia, Mo.

Arkansas State, which fell to 2-3 overall on the season, battled 4-0 Missouri throughout the first three quarters of the non-conference contest in front of 62,468 fans. The Red Wolves were behind only one point at halftime (14-13) and trailed by four points (20-16) after three quarters before Mizzou reeled off three fourth-quarter touchdowns.

The game featured productive offensive numbers as both teams eclipsed 400-yards in total offense as Arkansas State generated 425 yards while Missouri chalked up a 495-yards total. Individually, sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic set a school-record with 15 receptions for 117 yards while senior quarterback Adam Kennedy's 37 completions equaled an A-State single-game mark. Kennedy would finish the night throwing for 308 yards on 46 pass attempts.

A pair of field goals by senior kicker Brian Davis gave Arkansas State an early 6-0 lead, but Missouri erased the deficit on a touchdown two minutes left in the opening frame to go up 7-6. A-State turned its opening possession until a successful one as Davis' first field goal from 41 yards at 10:41 capped a nine-play, 46-yard scoring drive, which was highlighted by J.D. McKissic's 32-yard run on a misdirection play. A 21-yard Davis field goal with 3:35 remaining in the first quarter added to A-State's margin as the Red Wolves marched 76 yards in 10 plays. The A-State drive was aided by a 15-yard Mizzou personal foul infraction following a four-yard completion from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to J.D. McKissic. Mizzou's lone first-quarter score came 1:35 later via tailback Marcus Murphy's eight-yard run.

Missouri upped its lead to 14-6 at the second quarter's 11:57 mark when quarterback James Franklin threw a 68-yard scoring strike to wide receiver Donal Green-Beckham. However, the Red Wolves managed to pull back to within a single point at 14-13 as senior wide out Julian Jones outmuscled a Mizzou defender for the ball in the end zone for a 17-yard TD reception on a Kennedy pass to complete an 11-play, 56-yard drive. The score was set up as senior defensive tackle Darius Dunaway forced a fumble which junior linebacker Kyle Coleman re-

covered at the A-State 44-yard marker. A-State forced the Tigers into a three and out on their next possession and started out at its own three-yard line. The Red Wolves were able to move the ball all the way down to the Mizzou one-yard line, but the Tigers' defense made back-to-back goal-line-stands. Following its final timeout, A-State's David Oku was stuffed at the line of scrimmage on a second-and-goal attempt. Mizzou would thwart the Red Wolves' final attempt to get into the end zone on the opening half's final play as Oku was tackled for a 22-yard loss on a pass reception as time expired.

Arkansas State regained the lead early the third quarter as Brian Davis booted his third field goal of the game at 11:31 on a 44-yarder to wrap up a 48-yard, nine-play Red Wolves' scoring drive. The score remained that way until 3:39 left in the quarter when Mizzou went back on top 20-16 as James Franklin hit wide receiver L'Damian Washington on a five-yard TD pass. The Tigers' two-point conversion attempt failed as Franklin's pass was intercepted by junior cornerback Artez Brown in the end zone.

Mizzou put the game out of reach in the fourth quarter as the Tigers outscored the Red Wolves 21-3 in the final 15 minutes. A one-yard TD run by running back Henry Josey with 13:25 left gave Mizzou a 27-16 lead. A-State would close to 27-19 as Brian Davis split the uprights for the fourth time on the night with a 33-yard field goal at 7:31 to cap a 14-play, 59-yard drive. However, the Tigers would net a pair of TD's to close out the scoring as James Franklin scored on a nine-yard keeper just over five minutes to go and then tossed a five-yard TD aerial to Donal Green-Beckham with 2:56 left on the scoreboard.

The Red Wolves, who generated 25 first downs to Mizzou's 23 in the game, compiled 308 yards passing and 117 yards on the ground. The Tigers ran for 239 yards to go with 256 yards in the air. Individually for A-State, Julian Jones contributed 136 receiving yards on 10 grabs. Mizzou was led by James Franklin, who completed 20-of-29 passes for 255 yards, which included six to L'Damian Washington for 67 yards and four to Donal Green-Beckham for 95 yards. Tailback Russell Hansbrough rushed for 96 yards on eight carries to lead all rushers.

Leading the way for the A-State defense was junior linebacker Qushaun Lee, who totaled seven tackles (four solos) and Kyle Coleman contributed six tackles to go with a fumble recovery. Mizzou middle linebacker Andrew Wilson made a game-high 17 tackles (eight solos)

JONESBORO, Ark. (10/12/13) – Arkansas State provided its fans and alumni with plenty to cheer about as the Red Wolves claimed a 48-24 homecoming win over Idaho at Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

The victory, which marked A-State's ninth in its last 10 homecoming outings since 2003 and its third consecutive homecoming triumph, came in front of 26,781 fans as the Red Wolves evened their overall record to 3-3. Idaho fell to 1-6 on the season with the non-conference loss.

Arkansas State struck first on its initial play from scrimmage as senior quarterback Adam Kennedy hooked up with senior wide receiver Julian Jones on an 80-yard out-and-up touchdown pass play to give the Red Wolves a 7-0 lead. Jones, who would end up with 111 first-half receiving yards, managed to get open behind the Idaho secondary and outran two Vandals' defenders for the end zone after hauling in a Kennedy pass near midfield.

The Red Wolves increased their first-quarter advantage to 14-0 a little over four minutes later when Kennedy completed a 13-yard scoring toss to sophomore wide out J.D. McKissic, who pulled in the deflected ball while on flat on his back in the end zone as A-State moved the ball 65 yards in seven plays to payday. Idaho chipped into the Red Wolves' lead and cut the deficit into half at 14-7 with 1:29 left to go in the frame as running back James Baker scored untouched off right tackle from four yards out.

A 38-yard field goal by A-State senior kicker Brian Davis gave the Red Wolves a 10-point cushion at 17-7 in the second quarter with 6:43 left on the clock. Davis' field goal ended a 16-play, 66-yard scoring drive, which was helped by a 19-yard Darion Griswold pass catch from Kennedy. The Kennedy-Griswold combination struck again on A-State's next possession as Kennedy hit the Red Wolves' sophomore tight end on a 13-yard TD strike with 2:13 remaining to finish an 85-yard march as the hosts went up 24-7 before the end of the half.

A-State managed to increase its lead to 31-7 early in the third quarter as Adam Kennedy hit Darion Griswold in the back of the end zone from one yard away with 10:48 showing on the clock as the pair accounted for their second scoring play in a row. Idaho countered on its next possession with a field goal by kicker Austin

Rehkwow, who booted a 28-yarder around the seven-minute mark as the Vandals to make it 31-10. A R.J.Fleming 56-yard return on the ensuing kickoff put the ball into Idaho territory at the UI 43-yard line, but Adam Kennedy's pass was intercepted three plays later and returned 37 yards by safety Trey Williams to the A-State 39-yard line. The turnover helped set up an Idaho touchdown, a 15-yard TD pass from quarterback Taylor Davis to wide receiver Dezmon Epps, exactly three minutes later as the Vandals cut the margin to 31-17.

Idaho came right back with another touchdown on its second play in the fourth quarter as the Vandals scored 17 unanswered points as a result of running back James Baker's one-yard TD run to draw within 31-24 at the 14:22 mark. However, A-State would get those points back in one play 12 seconds later as J.D.McKissic took an Idaho kickoff from his two-yard line and ran a school third-longest 98 yards for the touchdown to give the Red Wolves a 38-24 advantage. The Red Wolves added a Brian Davis' 21-yard field goal with 6:19 remaining and tacked on seven more points at 2:39 on senior running back David Oku's three-yard TD scamper.

The Red Wolves piled up 26 first downs and 565 yards in total offense, which featured 375 yards in passing and 190 yards rushing. Adam Kennedy threw for a career game-high 375 yards, which included 260 in the first half, and four scores on 22-of-32 passing. J.D. McKissic hauled in nine of those aerials for 80 yards, Darion Griswold five for 89, and Julian Jones had four grabs for 135 yards as the trio accounted for a combined 304 receiving yards and all three of A-State's TD receptions. Senior running back Sirgregory Thornton's 85 rushing yards led the Red Wolves.

Idaho, which netted 386 total offensive yards with 212 in the air and 174 on the ground, was led by James Baker's game-leading 150 rushing yards on 23 carries and Taylor Davis' 199 yards in passing with a 14-of-39 performance.

Junior linebacker Qushaun Lee turned in a game-high 15 tackles for A-State and was aided by junior linebacker Kyle Coleman's career game-best nine stops. Junior free safety Sterling Young and senior defensive tackle Ryan Carrethers supplied seven tackles apiece. For Idaho, linebacker Marc Millan led the way with 11 tackles.
